




Now you can drag the map to whatever location you want (in this case Crystal Palace Park)



On the Chapter tab we can see the new chapter, and the pages that are within it

A final issue is that one of the pages (Bananas) only makes sense if another (Joseph Paxton) is read first.

I can click on Bananas to fix this.

Unlocking




